## Summarized Administrative Review Board Detainee Statement

The Presiding Officer read the Hearing Instructions to the Detainee and confirmed that he understood and had no questions.

The Assisting Military Officer presented Exhibit EC-A, the Enemy Combatant Notification Form to the Administrative Review Board. The AMO then presented Exhibit EC-B, the Enemy Combatant Election Form to the Administrative Review Board.

The Designated Military Officer presented Exhibits DMO-1, the Unclassified Summary of Information and DMO-2, the FBI Redaction Certification to the Administrative Review Board. He then gave a brief description of the contents of Exhibit DMO-1. The Designated Military Officer confirmed that he had no additional unclassified information to present and requested a closed session to present classified information relevant to the disposition of the Detainee.

The Presiding Officer opened the Administrative Review Board for the Detainee to present information with the assistance of the Assisting Military Officer.

Presiding Officer: The Detainee may now present information to the Administrative Review Board. Assisting Military Officer, does the Detainee want to present any information to this Administrative Review Board including written statements, oral statements, or witness statements prepared on his behalf?

Assisting Military Officer: Sir, I met with the Detainee approximately one month ago during the initial interview at which time the unclassified summary of evidence was read to him. Upon the completion of reading that summary the Detainee provided me very sparse comments of which I am going to convey to you now sir. The Detainee stated that he protests everything that is contained in the unclassified summary and that he wants to change all of his previous testimony. The Detainee provided me no additional comments but expressed to me his desire to speak at this hearing personally with the tribunal members. That is all I have sir.

The Presiding Officer asks the Detainee if he wishes to make a statement and if so will he take the Muslim oath. The Detainee declines taking the Muslim oath. The Assisting Military Officer will read the allegations on the unclassified summary to assist the Detainee in answering the allegations.

Assisting Military Officer: Al Ajmi went absent without leave from the Kuwaiti military in order to travel through Afghanistan to participate in the Jihad.

Detainee: That is not true.

Assisting Military Officer: Do you wish to provide any additional explanation?

Detainee: I went to Pakistan to learn and memorize the Koran. I never went to Afghanistan. I went to Pakistan.

Assisting Military Officer: Al Ajmi was issued an AK 47, ammunition and hand grenades by the Taliban.

Detainee: That is not true.

Presiding Officer: Al Ajmi, feel free to expand on your comments if you'd like.

Detainee: What do you want me to do?

Presiding Officer: You can answer however fully you wish to explain these statements or to counter them. If you just want to say "not true" or "yes" or "no," that is fine but if you would like to explain it more in depth, feel free.

Detainee: Yes, I do.

Presiding Officer: This is your opportunity to explain to us why these statements are either true or false according to your opinion.

Detainee: These statements were all said under pressure and threats. I couldn't take it. I couldn't bare the threats and the suffering so I started saying things. When every Detainee is captured they tell him that he is either Taliban or Al-Qaida and that is it. I couldn't bare the suffering and the threatening and the pressure so I had to say I was from Taliban.

Assisting Military Officer: The next statements come from the category of Al Ajmi participated in military operations against the coalition. Al Ajmi admitted he was in Afghanistan fighting with the Taliban in the Bagram area.

Detainee: It is not true.

Assisting Military Officer: Al Ajmi was placed in a defensive position by the Taliban in order to block the Northern Alliance.

Detainee: I am not an enemy combatant. I said this only because I was under pressure and threats and suffering.

Assisting Military Officer: Al Ajmi admitted spending eight months in the front line at the Aiubi Center in Afghanistan.

Detainee: I never entered Afghanistan. I never fought with anyone. My intentions were to stay four months only but under the circumstances I had to stay for eight months. I never fought. My intentions were never to go to Afghanistan my intentions were to go to Pakistan.

Assisting Military Officer: Al Ajmi admitted engaging in two or three firefights with the Northern Alliance.

Detainee: This never happened and I never participated in any fighting.

Assisting Military Officer: Al Ajmi retreated to the Tora Bora region in Afghanistan and was later captured as he attempted to escape to Pakistan.



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Detainee: I have never heard of Tora Bora.

Assisting Military Officer: The next questions come under the category of Al Ajmi is committed to Jihad. Al Ajmi went absent without leave because he wanted to participate in the Jihad in Afghanistan but could not get leave from the military.

Detainee: The group I went to is a peaceful group. They don't fight. I went with this group called Tabligh. This group is a peaceful group that studies the Koran. I did not go absent without leave to participate in Jihad.

Assisting Military Officer: In August of 2004 Al Ajmi wanted to make sure that when the case went in front of the tribunal, that the tribunal members know that he is now a Jihadist, an enemy combatant and that he would kill as many Americans as he possible can.

Detainee: That is impossible that I would say such a thing. How could I fight the Americans? They were with me in the military in Kuwait. I would've fought them in Kuwait not here. How can I fight them here? How can I try to kill them here?

Assisting Military Officer: Upon arrival at the Guantanamo detention facility, Al Ajmi has been constantly in trouble. Al Ajmi's over all behavior has been aggressive and non-compliant and has resided in the disciplinary blocks throughout his detention.

Detainee: Yes. I never did any harm to anybody. Yes, it is true that they put me in a different block but only because I wanted to tell my voice to people. I didn't have a lawyer to defend me. I didn't have anybody to defend me. That was the only way to let them know or to defend myself.

Assisting Military Officer: Based upon a review of the recommendations from the United States agencies and classified and unclassified documents, Al Ajmi is regarded as a continued threat to the United States and it's allies.

Detainee: You are the judge and you are the president. You are everything here. You can do whatever you wish. I never meant harm to anybody. I never attacked anybody. I don't have a grudge against the Americans. It is up to you. You are the president and you will do whatever you wish.

Assisting Military Officer: There are no primary factors that favor the release or transfer of this Detainee.

Presiding Officer: Al Ajmi, do you have anything else that you would like to present to this board?

Detainee: I would like to change all the allegations that are stated against me and I would like justice. That is all I want.

Presiding Officer: Al Ajmi, does that conclude your statement?

Detainee: I have nothing else to say.



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Presiding Officer: Did the Assisting Military Officer's statement provide the information that you wanted us to hear?

Detainee: Yes, I am satisfied.

### Board Members Questions to the Detainee.

Board Member: Can you explain what Tabligh is and what your part was in the organization?

Detainee: This Tabligh group existed in America. You can check it and know all about it. It is all known here in America.

Board Member: Can you answer my question?

Detainee: My role was in this Tabligh to call people to pray, to do good. To let people know that there is an end to this world so they can pray and do well.

Board Member: Is it a religious organization?

Detainee: Yes, it is.

Board Member: Al Ajmi I believe that your dedication to your religion is genuine, what direction or path will that dedication take should you be released?

Detainee: For peace.

Board Member: OK, having said that I feel with that answer in mind that there is some sense of injustice on the part of your detention. Can that desire for peace and the anger you feel for the injustice coexist or live together?

The linguist asks for the question to be rephrased in order to convey the correct question to the Detainee. The Presiding Officer rephrases the question.

Presiding Officer: Being detained here, does that affect your ideology of the peace concept that you just mentioned?

Detainee: I don't blame the Americans for what they did by bringing us over here and detaining us over here. If I were in their place I would go out and look for terrorism all over the world like they did but I have a feeling it is going to be a just decision by the Americans. That is my feeling. I would do the same thing if I were in their shoes. I would capture the bad people, the terrorists and bring them over here and detain them.

Presiding Officer: Al Ajmi, you stated that you were in the Kuwaiti military. What branch, was it the Army?

Detainee: Yes it was government's military.

Presiding Officer: What was your rank and responsibilities?





Detainee: I was a soldier and you have it in your files. You have everything you need on your files. I was just a soldier.

Presiding Officer: Were you released from your obligations? It says you went absent without leave and you deny that so were you released from your military obligation in Kuwait?

Detainee: They didn't really let me go. I just wanted to leave so I can go and spend four months there and learn. I am entitled to leave of absence so my intentions were to go for four months and when I came back I would show them that I had sick days or leave of absence permission. I will get it from the doctor but really they didn't let me go.

Presiding Officer: You stated earlier that you had no intentions to go to Afghanistan. Is that correct?

Detainee: Yes, that is true. I never had intentions to go to Afghanistan. I wanted to go to Pakistan.

Presiding Officer: I understand intentions but were you forced to go to Afghanistan? Are you saying you've never been in Afghanistan or were you forced to go to Afghanistan?

Detainee: I never entered Afghanistan and my intentions were to go to Pakistan.

Presiding Officer: Al Ajmi, how old were you when Iraq invaded Kuwait?

Detainee: I was young. Now I am twenty-seven years old. God knows, I was probably about fifteen years old.

Presiding Officer: Al Ajmi, do you have any other comments you would like to make to this board at this time? Any final comments?

Detainee: All I want from you is justice.

Presiding Officer: OK.

The Presiding Officer reads the post-Administrative Board instructions to the Detainee and adjourns the open session of the Board.

#### Dear Commander

- (a) The family of Abdullah Al-Ajmi has requested that we submit materials to the Annual Review Board (ARB) on his behalf, to be provided to and considered by the ARB in accordance with Administrative Review Board Process §§ 3(f)(1)(a), 3(f)(1)(d)(7) and Administrative Review Board Process Step-by-Step § 1(g).
- The members of Abdullah's family, which includes his parents and numerous brothers and sisters, have sent letters that they request the ARB take into consideration. These letters demonstrate that Abdullah is a valued member of his family and his community, and as such does not pose an ongoing threat to the United States or its allies. His parents characterize him as an obedient, calm child with a kind, generous, and outgoing disposition, and his brothers and sisters remember his sense of humor and his love of animals. Abdullah has many relatives and friends, who he used to take turns visiting. Several members of his family note that Abdullah has always been eager to assist other members of the community, and his brother recollects how he once rushed to the scene of a nearby accident and helped to save the lives of several members of the injured family. Given Abdullah's close involvement with and high esteem in the eyes of his family and community, it is highly unlikely that he would engage in any behavior that would make him a threat to the United States.
- (4) The letters from Abdullah's family also provide information regarding Abdullah's age, work history, education, and family status, to be considered by the ARB pursuant to Administrative Review Board Process § 3(f)(1)(d)(10). Abdullah is still a young man, only

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twenty-three when first detained. His absence is particularly hard on his parents and siblings, not only because of their strong emotional ties to him, but also because he played a primary role in the economic life of the family, purchasing all of their household goods. Abdullah held a job, tended to the sheep on the farm with his dog Johnny, and also bred falcons for hunting. In additional to learning about animals, his hobbies are painting and photography. Abdullah has much to return to, and his family is eager and anxious for him to return home.

- Abdullah's family would also like to resubmit personal information and documentation that was previously requested by and submitted to the Department of Defense, but which is also relevant to the ARB proceedings under Administrative Review Board Process § 3(f)(1)(d)(10). The "Personal Particulars" document submitted by Abdullah's brother contains information about Abdullah's age, marital status, family, and education, and employment.
  - (u) Finally, please note that these submissions do not constitute a waiver of the detainee's right to pursue his petition for habeas corpus and related claims brought in Al Odah v. United States of America, D.D.C., Civil Action No. 02-828 (CKK).

Finally I appeal you to return my son. I seize this opportunity that was granted to me to speak and say that my son is innocent and he has nothing to do with what happened. Please return my son to me, please return him soon.
