| [redacted] stated he is tired and had recently showered which is why his hair was wet. He discussed his polygraph results of a month ago in which he was deceptive and stated the machine and method was in error as it had misread one of the questions regarding his receiving any training while in Afghanistan. He again stated that he had not received any training. Testing procedures were discussed in general terms although [redacted] continued to state the machine and method of testing was in error. | | | b6 -3,4 |

| He has not sent or received any mail for a long time and his last interview was conducted approximately two weeks ago. | | | |
| [redacted] was introduced to a new interrogator who requested they discuss some of the items in the file as there were questions needing clarification. [redacted] indicated an unwillingness to discuss any topic previously addressed, stating everything is in the file and that he is very tired of being misled by interrogators who never offer the detainees any benefit for their assistance. He was instructed again of the various levels of Camps, those privileges each camp has to offer, as well as the disciplinary levels within the camps, and other items such as books. [redacted] did not feel these rewards were enough incentive to warrant his continued assistance aside from any new material being discussed. | | | b6 -3,4 |

| A question was asked concerning a previous report of his providing explosives while in Afghanistan. He asked if the question was an attempt by the interrogators to deceive him and use the information in a court of law. After being advised it was not a trick question he denied any accountability for ever having involvement in explosives in Afghanistan. [redacted] complained of losing his memory and being subjected to mental torture far greater than what he would experience if [redacted] if arrested in those countries for the same reason. | | | b6 -3,4 |

| [redacted] made one request of having another [redacted] placed in an adjacent cell so he would be able to speak with someone from his own country. [redacted] was interviewed on 5/31/03 at Camp Delta, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba by Special Agents [redacted] (FBI) and [redacted] (NCIS). [redacted] was acting as the [redacted] translator. [redacted] provided the following information:

[redacted] said that he would not talk or cooperate until such time as he was permitted to make a telephone call to his family. It was explained to [redacted] that "it doesn't work that way". [redacted] would have to tell the truth about his activities with [redacted] before he would be allowed any extra privileges.

[redacted] stated that many of the detainees were being mistreated. Some were being brought into interrogations, late at night, and beaten. [redacted] said that he was not personally aware of this, but it is common knowledge among the detainees. [redacted] showed the interviewers his chest and stomach by lifting up his shirt. [redacted] appeared to claim that he had been beaten. There was no visible sign of injury. When asked about details, [redacted] reverted back to the fact that he wanted a phone call.

[redacted] said that this was the most he had ever talked, but would not talk again until he got phone call. [redacted] is concerned about the welfare of his family and wants to let them know he is alright. [redacted] appears to be evaluating his interviewers. He commented that a previous interrogator, [redacted] was not very clever. [redacted] wondered if SA [redacted] was in fact "American". [redacted] remarked that SA [redacted] was "dangerous". [redacted] did not elaborate.

[redacted] believes that he will never leave Camp Delta and is prepared to stay indefinitely. [redacted] was told that detainees, to include Saudis, are leaving. [redacted] did not believe this. When [redacted] first got to Camp Delta, he thought he would be one of the first people to leave. "Everyone" thought the same thing. [redacted] now believes that he will be at Camp Delta for a very long time and has lost all hope of ever getting out.
