On 25 Oct 02, [redacted] was interviewed by Special Agent (SA) [redacted] U.S. Army Criminal Investigation Command and linguist [redacted] at Camp Delta Detention Facility, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. The interview was conducted [redacted]		
[redacted] was interviewed due to his request to see an interviewer. [redacted] advised he is surrounded by [redacted] and is very stressed [redacted] He stated the others [redacted] continue to torment him. [redacted] requested to be moved to a cell near [redacted] so he had others to talk to. He advised that he understands some [redacted] but cannot speak the language. He advised he hurts himself because he wants to return home and believed if he killed himself he would be sent home in a box and his brothers would have closure. [redacted] understood his case is being reviewed and advised he will be patient, but re-iterated being close to other [redacted] would reduce his stress. He understood that continuing to hurt himself would not further his cause and he should be in the best of health if returned home. [redacted] advised he did not have a thought out plan to kill himself, and agreed to behave himself for the remainder of his stay in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.		
[redacted] was questioned regarding conflicting stories [redacted]		
When asked what was happening [redacted] advised several of "them" are talking of jihad and have vowed to resume jihad against the U.S. upon release. He identified the following individuals from the detainee photo books:		
[redacted] he is the leader [redacted] and tells people when to eat, sleep, and not to talk to interviewers. He advised [redacted] will ask him what he said to the interviewers when he returns to his cell as he does with everyone else on the block. He has issued a Fatwah against the U.S.		
[redacted] also talks of jihad against the U.S. upon release, he was found with a rope that he was making by the Military Police (MP), he planned to strangle an MP when he was released for a shower or exercise.		
[redacted] talks of jihad against the U.S. upon release.		
[redacted] (name unknown) talks of jihad against the U.S. upon release.		
[redacted] talks of jihad against the U.S. upon release.		
[redacted] constantly talks of jihad against the U.S. upon release.		
[redacted] ruined his leg during jihad, also issued Fatwah against the U.S., and talks of jihad against the U.S. upon release.

The interview was conducted by Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Special Agent (SA) [redacted] Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS), Special Agent (SA) [redacted] and [redacted] Language Specialist [redacted] Sgt., Department of the Army [redacted] translator [redacted] was advised of the nature of the interview and the identity of the interviewing Agents. b7C -3,4 American authorities while under duress. He advised the American interrogators that [redacted]

it only after enduring several hours of being questioned, screamed at, and called a liar. [redacted] believed that if he told the Americans what they wanted to hear the interrogation would stop. He advised during the questioning the Americans repeatedly asked him if he knew the location of MULAH MOHAMMAD OMAR and/or USAMA BIN LADEN, and many other questions, however, at the present time he is unable to advise the nature of all the questions and what his responses were. [redacted] advised he does remember them asking him [redacted] advised that statement was untrue and only provided in an attempt to end the interrogation. [redacted] was asked by the American interrogators for the name of [redacted] advised he provided the interrogators with a name, however, he is unable to remember the name he provided at this time.

[redacted] advised that [redacted] told him that the United States is very weak and in financial ruin because of the Trade Center bombing. [redacted] stated that the delegation told him that the United States cannot afford to keep and feed the few hundred prisoners in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, anymore and the Americans asked [redacted] to come and find out their stories. [redacted] advised that [redacted] told him to cooperate and tell them everything. [redacted] stated that the delegation told him that he would be released back to [redacted] Government soon. [redacted] stated that if the United States were in financial trouble, he [redacted] would help and work for their food, so they can stay in Guantanamo Bay and offset some of the financial troubles of the United States. [redacted] was shouting at him and threatening him. [redacted] afraid that [redacted] were going to hurt him, but he did not say anything to them. [redacted] advised that at the first interview with [redacted] he was brought in at approximately 2 p.m. and was kept to 8 p.m., that night. [redacted] stated that he missed dinner and he was not able to eat. [redacted] advised that on the second interview, [redacted] kept him in the interview room for approximately seven hours and turned the air conditioner down cold to make him freeze. [redacted] advised that he did not speak to [redacted] on the second interview. [redacted] advised that [redacted] told him that just because he was not answering their questions in Guantanamo Bay, did he think he could stay quiet when [redacted] Government gets him home to [redacted] [redacted] stated that [redacted] told him when he gets home to [redacted] that he will talk under torture. On the third interview [redacted] stated that he was sarcastic when he answered some of the [redacted]'s questions. [redacted] advised that [redacted] asked him if the United States had a [redacted] translator. [redacted] stated that he told [redacted] "no" and that the United States have an American man who speaks [redacted] [redacted] stated that [redacted] asked some of the other [redacted] detainees, if they knew the number of U.S. soldiers that were at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. [redacted] stated that [redacted] told him that they can pay two people to say that they saw [redacted] commit terrorist acts. [redacted] stated that [redacted] accused him of being a terrorist, knowing USAMA BIN LADEN, and being a part of Al-Qaeda.

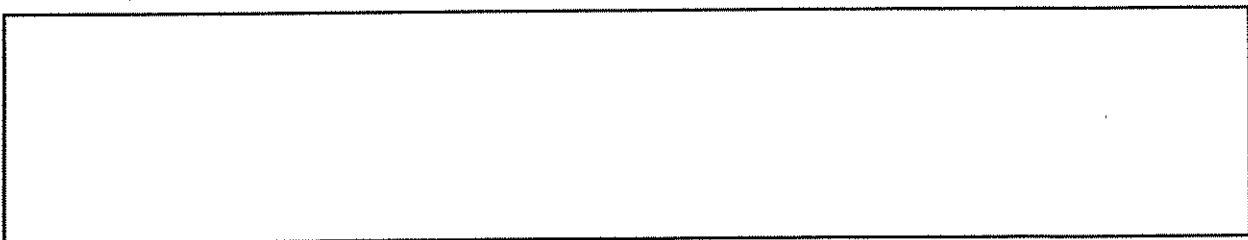

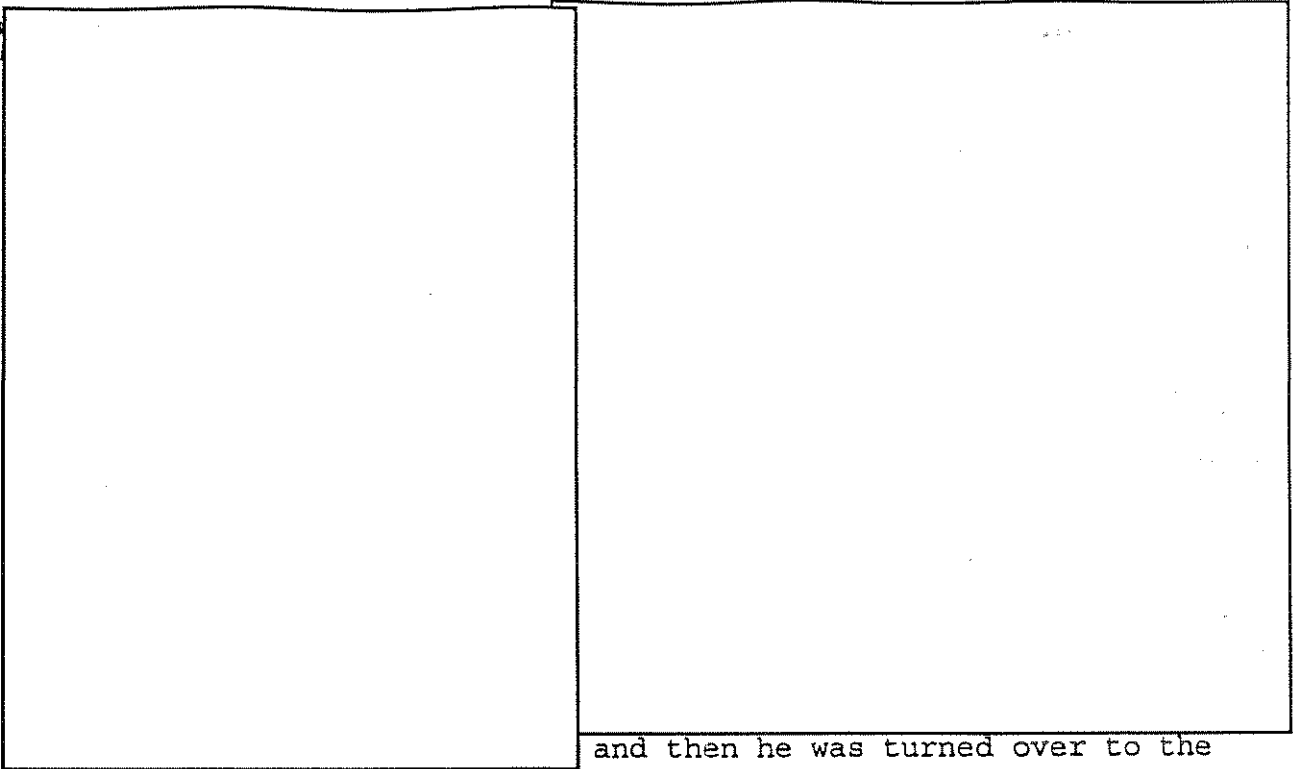

[redacted] advised that while at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, America has been very nice and has treated him really well. [redacted] stated that he knows that the United States is the only country that will stand up to the tyrannical governments that practice genocide and protect the poor and weak people around the world. [redacted] advised that his life is simple and he does not mind being sent back and dying in his own country for a worthwhile cause of freeing his people. [redacted] stated that he does not want to be sent back [redacted] to die for no reason. [redacted] advised that he would rather go to the United States or some other western democratic country, where he can claim political asylum. [redacted] was interviewed at Camp Delta, Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. Also present for the interview was Special Agent (SA) [redacted] Naval Criminal Investigative Service. The interview was conducted in Arabic, and Department of Defense contract language specialist [redacted] provided [redacted] translation throughout the interview. After being advised of the identities of the interviewing agents and the nature of the interview, [redacted] provided the following information:

[redacted] was experiencing [redacted] and [redacted] [redacted] had had trouble with [redacted] and he fell [redacted] and hurt [redacted] again. [redacted] generally was not taking advantage of the recreation time afforded him at the camp. [redacted] felt that his human rights were being violated and that he should be represented by an attorney. [redacted] did not like his treatment, and felt he and others were being treated like slaves.

He was assured that every attempt was made to keep from interviewing him until the end of Ramadan. [redacted] asked one of the interviewers to swear that he had done everything possible to avoid the interview before the end of Ramadan.

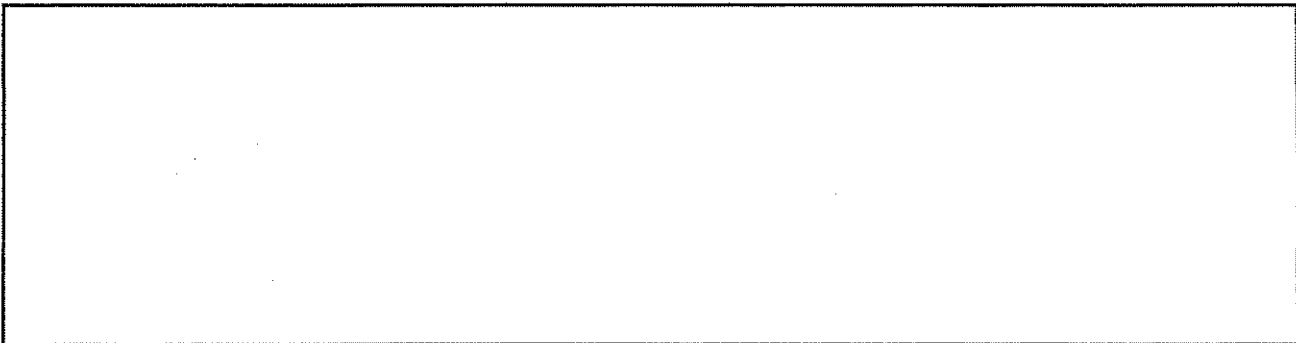
[redacted] was asked again about the possibility of a planned mass suicide occurring amongst the detainees at the Camp. He said that it was not applicable for him, in his state of being, to commit suicide. He would not say if it might be applicable for others in the Camp to commit suicide. He has heard talk from previous interviewers and from other detainees pertaining to rumors of suicide. Suicide might be possible since detainees are provided sheets and blankets. The Muslim religion and fatwas generally prohibit the taking of one's own life except during exceptional circumstances, i.e.: the torturing of an individual during interrogation. [redacted] is not aware of specific plans for coordinated suicide of the detainees.

During a prior interview (FD-302 dated 10/26/2002) [REDACTED] made the comment: "I got out of the circle and now I am in chains." He was asked about the meaning of this comment. He said he did not remember the reason he said it and asked to be told what the comment was in relation to. When told that it concerned [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] became defensive and stared at the ground. He told the interviewers to "check the tapes", referring to his belief that all interviews are video taped. [REDACTED] also pointed out that he believes [REDACTED] has been hired by the United States and is being paid to provide information to authorities. [REDACTED] was told that information regarding his involvement in a terrorist training camp came from multiple sources, not just [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] said that if [REDACTED] provided the information, he was also being paid. [REDACTED] was reminded of an earlier statement he made indicating his hate for [REDACTED] and was told that [REDACTED] was only disappointed with [REDACTED]. At this point, [REDACTED] looked up and asked if [REDACTED] was in custody.

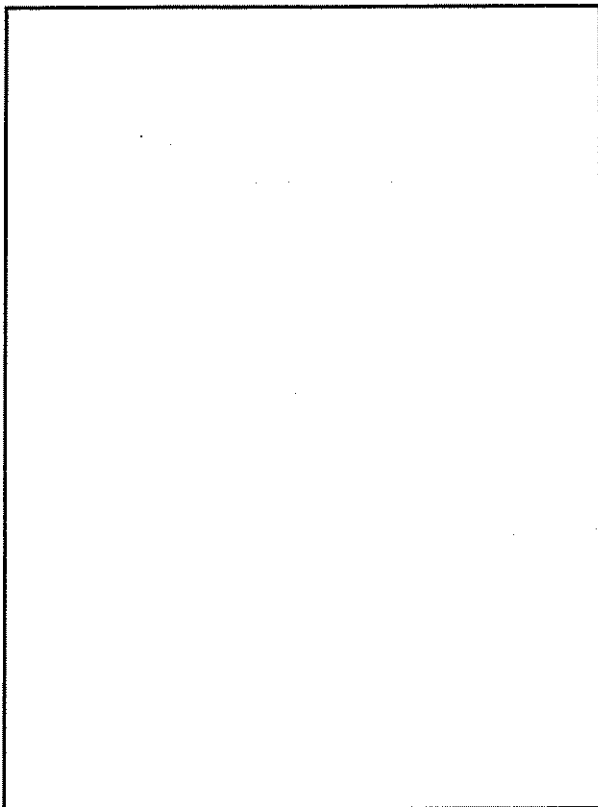

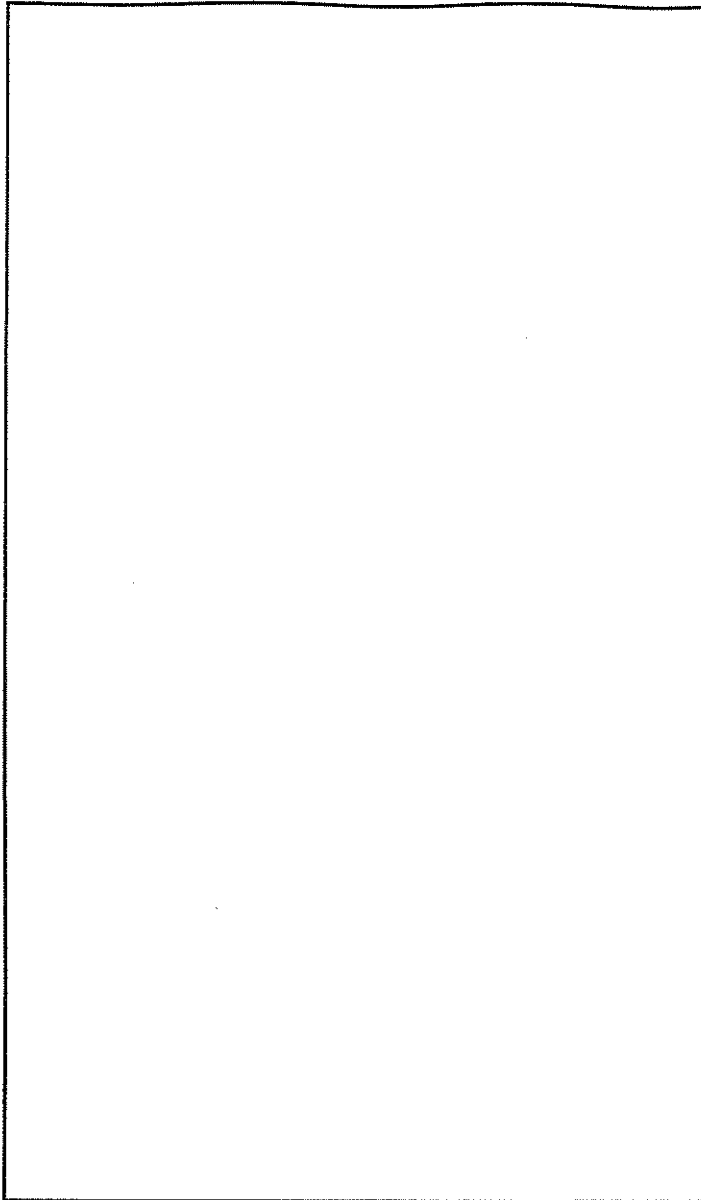
